Our ongoing transformation in Christ is crucial. As we allow his love to continually shape us, we are empowered by this same love to authentically love others in a way that reflects God's love.





#### The Foundation – The Gospel Invitation

The gospel is the story of how God comes to humanity to restore us to himself. It is the good news about Jesus Christ. It is central to our Christian faith and everything we do at Coastlands.

The gospel invites each one of us to come and respond to God. To engage with the life-changing waters that will transform us.

*"Come everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and he who has no money, come buy and eat! Come buy wine and milk without money and without price" (Isaiah 55:1).* 

*"If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of His heart will flow rivers of living water" (John 7:37-39).* 

The need for transformation through Christ is universal.

The gospel invitation of life has already been generously given to all – there is nothing further we need to do or work for.

However, the story of God restoring us to himself is an ongoing experience throughout our entire lives, not just the moment we first embrace this good news.

*"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9)*

#### The Heart - The Gospel Outworked

We don't just respond to the gospel in our hearts; it needs to become a lived reality in our daily lives, affecting those around us.

Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of His heart will flow rivers of living water''' (John 7:37-39).

God's plan to restore humanity unfolds within us and through us. When the gospel deeply influences our lives, the life-giving peace, hope, love, and joy we receive also touch and impact those around us. Through the restoration of what's broken in our lives, God reveals his goodness and glory to everyone, whether they know him or not.

God's heart has always been one of restoration and hope for humanity. Jesus echoed this when he spoke the words from Isaiah 61 in Luke 4.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; To proclaim the year of the Lords favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; To comfort all who mourn; to give them beauty for ashes and the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the garment of praise instead of a heavy spirit. That they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that he may be glorified. They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations" (Isaiah 61:1-4).


This transformation isn't something we achieve—it's the result of God's presence within us. As we abide in Christ, His Spirit renews and transforms us, producing lasting fruit—love, joy, peace, and more. Jesus said:

*"I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5).* 

It is not our effort but Christ living in us that brings true change.

*"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20).* 

God doesn't ask us to do something or be something. Instead, He invites us to give our whole lives to him. To let him work in and through us, transforming us with his love so that we can love - like Him.



### **PART 2: WHAT WE DO**



To love like Jesus means extending love to those around us in our church and local community, as well as those beyond.

We know that "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). This truth allows us to love others and meet their needs in line with the mission, message, and character of Christ, rather than relying on our own understanding.

With Christ at the centre of our lives, we prioritise His truth and his way over our own.

Our desire is that through the ordinary moments and needs of life we may preserve dignity, and authentically and lovingly engage people (both within and outside of the church) with the life transforming reality of the gospel.

#### **Gospel Mission**

The challenges we face in our own lives are often the vehicle through which God engages our hearts. The same is true for others in our church, as well as people in our local community and across the world.



We encourage you to prayerfully consider what God has resourced you with and where you can be actively involved.


#### **Guiding Principles**

Coastlands is a community focused on the gospel, serving others with dignity, empathy, and encouragement.

- 1. We work together in unity and team, beginning with our elders (team).
- 2. The eldership team provide oversight of all initiatives (safety).
- 3. The gospel guides everything we do and how we do it (heart).
- 4. We create a safe place that preserves dignity, with empathy and compassion at the core (a safehouse).
- 5. We consider sustainability for people and resources in everything we approach (effective).
- 6. Our building efforts are not just for today but for the future (expansive).
- 7. We build as a team, not relying on individuals or personalities (inclusive).
- 8. All our activities are rooted in relationships (connection).
- 9. We flexibly address specific community needs for a time, as we are able (targeted).
- 10. We identify needs, practice, and refine processes within our community before extending to the broader community (genuine care).




